As you can tell, it will be a busy semester, but we are confident it will go well. Continue reading for important dates, deadlines, and information. Have a great spring!



March 11–16 SPRING BREAK

April 1 Last day an undergraduate student may, with the dean's

approval, withdraw from the University or drop a class except for urgent and substantiated, nonacademic

reasons. Last day a student may change registration in a class

to or from the pass/fail or credit/no credit basis.

April 10-12, Academic advising for continuing and readmitted students

& 15-19 for the summer session and the fall semester.

April 19 Last day students can submit course load reduction application

(for time-sensitive or extenuating circumstances), with

supporting documentation required.

April 15-26 Daily Registration for the summer session and the fall

semester for continuing & readmitted students.

April 29 Last class day in the School of Law.

May 1-4, 6-11, Spring semester final exams in the School of Law.

& 13-14

May 3 Last class day except in the School of Law. Last day to submit

master's report, recital, thesis, doctoral dissertation, or treatise to the graduate dean. Last day a <u>graduate</u> student may, with the required approvals, drop a class or withdraw from the University.

Last day students can submit medical and mental health

withdrawal application, with supporting documentation required.

May 6-7, 12 No-class days.

There is a Sorenson VP-100 located in the Services for Students with Disabilities office, SSB 4.206 available Monday-Friday from 8:00 am-5:00 pm. There is a P3/Purple Videophone kiosk located in the Student Activity Center (SAC) on the first floor in the northeast hallway

just across from Taco Cabana, leading out to College of Liberal Arts (CLA) building. Want to stop by Student Financial Services or University Health Center quickly for a follow-up question? Will Rogers Memorial Scholarship

The Will Rogers Memorial Scholarship is awarded to a limited number of qualified students registered at The University of Texas at Austin. This scholarship is intended for students with disabilities or students studying to work with people with disabilities, especially children with disabilities. "Disabled" in this context shall refer to students who have a physical or non-physical disability, including mental hardships and obstacles caused by the environment and lack of opportunity. Lois Ford LaBauve Scholarship

This scholarship is given in memory of Lois Ford LaBauve, and in honor of Ms. LaBauve's daughter, Louise Saxon. Ms. LaBauve was a Texas schoolteacher for many years and always displayed a passion for learning. From 1961-1972 LaBauve was the Director of Services for the Blind and Disabled at the Texas State Library. During her tenure with the library system, LaBauve founded the Texas Talking Book program. In later life, LaBauve lost most of her sight and thus had personal experience with visual disabilities. In 2002, when LaBauve created the endowment, her daughter, Louise Saxon, said "My mother would like

for the endowment to help educate more people who overcome visual disabilities and exhibit real potential for making a difference in the world.

At least one scholarship for a minimum of \$500 will be awarded in 2013. If funding is available, additional scholarships and/or scholarships of a larger monetary value will be awarded. Further information about scholarship qualifications and applications for the Lois Ford La-Bauve and Louise Saxon Endowed Scholarship will be sent out during the spring semester.

Carole L. Patterson Endowed **Scholarship**

The Carole L. Patterson Endowed Scholarship is awarded to a limited number of qualified students registered at The University of Texas at Austin. This scholarship is intended for students with physical disabilities enrolled in at least six hours at UT Austin, with preference given to students with a mobility disability. Applicants must have at least a 2.5 UT GPA. Financial need may be used to distinguish among applicants. For more information visit: http:// www.texasscholarships.org/types/
